Marconi: The Man Who Connected the World

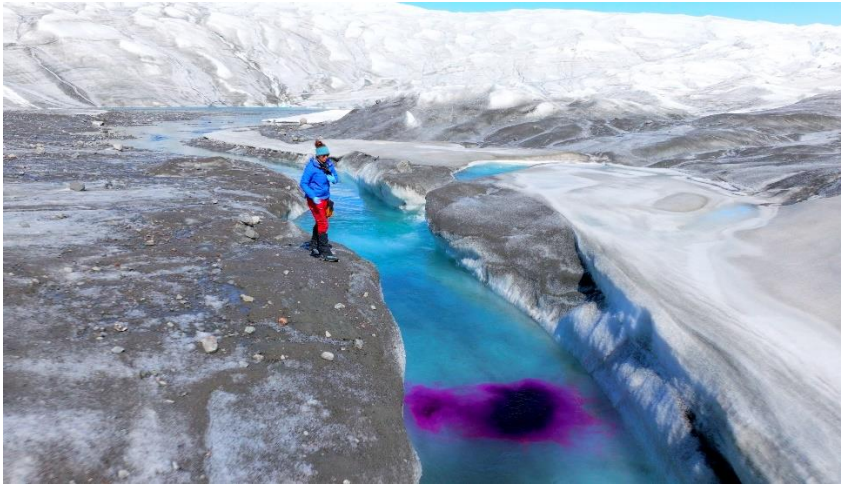

After the war, children who lost their Japanese fathers faced hardships, labeled "stateless" due to the Philippines' nationality laws, which followed the father's citizenship, and lived in hiding amid growing anti-Japanese sentiment.

Israel-Palestine Conflict



According to United Nations statistics, since the outbreak of the Israel-Palestine conflict, approximately 17,000 children in the Gaza Strip have been separated from their parents and ultimately orphaned due to Israeli airstrikes.

CGTN reporters, through close-ups, have documented the experiences of these Gaza orphans, revealing their suffering amid the war and their longing for stable homes. The report profoundly reflects the severe psychological trauma endured by Gaza's children during the conflict and their uncertainty about the future, highlighting the profound impact of the conflict on Palestinian children.

How Hard is it to Get A Public Park Open 24/7 In Shanghai vs New York



“What would it take for New Yorkers to agree for Central Park to be open 24 hours?” Reporter Sun Siqi challenged from the first second of the video.

Under what is traditionally understood to be common practice in a Western democracy, like the United States, people would fight over a thousand reasons so Central Park would NOT become a 24/7 property (and it is still not). The motion would be easily rejected at the city hall for reasons including taxpayers' money, potential danger caused by a rising number of homeless people, and potential increase in crimes. On the other side of the planet, the same motion was brought up over a public park in Shanghai. How would take work out?

In Gaza, as hope faded, Rafah became the last refuge for Palestinians amid heavy attacks. Palestinian journalist Nizar Sadawi reported for TRT World for 185 days under constant bombardment.

He witnessed horrific scenes—children killed, people starving in tent camps, and his own home bombed. Narrowly escaping death multiple times, Nizar reported non-stop, sleeping beside his camera. Many friends and colleagues were killed, including his mother during evacuation. Despite the dangers, Nizar believes the work of Palestinian journalists was vital in showing the world the harsh reality in Gaza.

After 15 years of running the classroom, the teacher's most prized possessions are her incomplete notes. Children with cancer died before they could finish writing their journals.

Each family member has a number of balloons representing the memories they've gained over time, with the grandfather having the most. Artin loves when his grandpa shares their special memories together.

Despite Artin's efforts, the loss speeds up, and eventually, Grandpa forgets everything, including their shared moments. Heartbroken, Artin's parents remind him that although Grandpa's balloons are gone, Artin now holds them and must become the storyteller, sharing those memories with Grandpa.

Armed with special microphones, he records the whispering wind, trees sinking into rising seas, an Ainu instrument maker crafting bamboo mouth harps, and fishermen using traditional tools to preserve future shellfish. In the finale, SHOW-GO creates a music piece from these sounds, ensuring they are remembered. *MIRADOR* encourages the younger generation to slow down and appreciate the world around them, beyond quick snapshots.

Prasar Bharati (PB) - India

My Time: Anima Brahma, Former National Champion and International Track and Field Athlete



Anima Brahma began her sprinting career in school, making her mark at the 1974 Cross-Country Championship in Udaipur, India, at just 15 years old. She set numerous records in the 200m and 400m events at State Athletic Meets and National School Games.

Anima also represented India at the Asian Track and Field Meeting in Tokyo in 1979. Despite her talent and selection for the Moscow Spartakiad Games, she never participated in the Asian Games or the Olympics due to injuries and a lack of sports medicine. She retired early at 25 but remained active in athletics, representing Eastern Railways at the national level throughout her career.

Baseball Boys of Ishikawa: Overcoming the New Year's Day Earthquake

About two weeks later, the team relocated to an affiliated school in Yamanashi to resume their activities. Seiya Fukumori, a player from Wajima City, faced the challenges of the disaster while setting his sights on the Koshien National High School Baseball Tournament. This program follows the lives of high school baseball players over three months as they strive to compete on the prestigious Koshien stage, carrying the hopes and feelings of their disaster-stricken community with them.

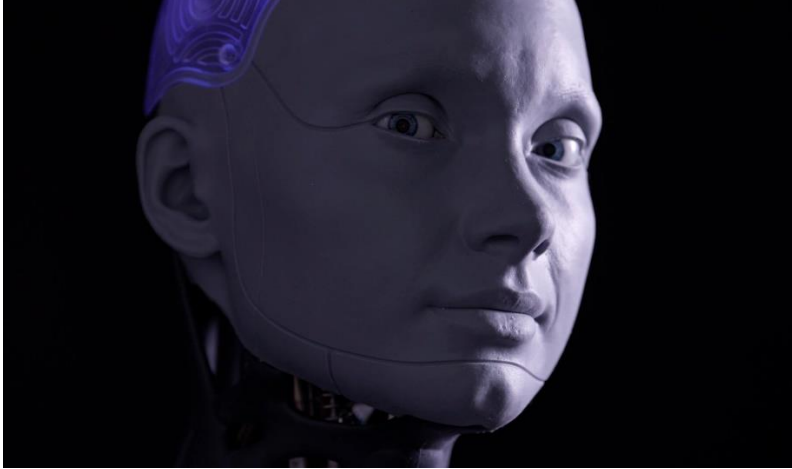

Lucia, a teacher of the workshop in the Nisida prison, goes to the penitentiary to start working with the boys. Her hesitations, but also the welcome, curiosity, and distrust of those minors.

The episode opens with a fragment of the speech that the great Neapolitan playwright Eduardo De Filippo gave to the Italian Parliament in 1982 to draw attention to the conditions of young inmates in Neapolitan prisons. He was the one who founded the workshop discussed in the series.

Special Broadcasting Service (SBS) – Australia *First Nations peoples and cultures | Bonus episode*



This podcast guides new migrants and prospective Australian citizens in embracing the rich heritage of Australia's First Nations peoples, fostering a deeper understanding and appreciation of their cultures and histories. Listeners will learn about the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, the original custodians of this land, and explore their ancient traditions with insights from Rhoda Roberts AO, a Widjabul Wiyebal woman from the Bundjalung nation who coined "Welcome to Country."

The podcast also highlights how engaging with First Nations cultures enhances the sense of belonging in Australia, featuring the perspectives and personal experiences of Wiradjuri warriors, Luke Carrol and Angeline Penrith.

Through a first-person narrative, sound, and music, the podcast takes listeners to visit the only school in a vast township at 4,500 meters above sea level on the Qinghai-Xizang (Tibet) Plateau. Away from their homes and family members, more than 200 kids and their teachers take care of and support each other. It's a whole different life from the tech-linked world.

The kids all long to wander into the world beyond the snow-capped mountains. A lack of oxygen and power supply and freezing temperatures almost all year round are not reasons enough to keep the kids and teachers from striving for their dreams with love, resilience, and devotion. The story also gives a glimpse into the teachers' inner struggle as they are caught between a determination to help the students achieve their goals and a fear that the kids might lose what they now hold dear and strong after they step into modern society.

Crazy Town



This documentary tells the story of a former asylum and its place: a small town nestled in the hills of southern Italy, called Girifalco. Founded in 1881, the psychiatric hospital and townspeople long progressed in symbiosis.

With the initiation of "open doors" practices as soon as the early 1900s, patients deemed less serious went freely on village streets. Madness and normality melded in a peculiar blend that over the centuries, brought national and international notoriety to Girifalco, as the town of the insane. More rudely, "Crazy Town". Local people, far from experiencing the label as a stigma, took pride in their identity. But what happens to that town when the asylum closes and the "crazies" leave?

Pacific Scientific – The town in the shadow of PNG's most dangerous volcano



Pacific Scientific takes you deep into Pacific region to meet the scientists and communities living and breathing science and research. Audiences are literally taken across the Pacific in the series, which travels to Tonga, Solomon Islands, Fiji, PNG and beyond. Each episode takes the listener to another location to meet another incredible scientist and their work.

Leading science journalists from Australia and the Pacific take you on the journey each episode. In the episode we are entering into the awards, you're taken to a town in the shadow of PNG's most dangerous volcano. In 1994 Mt Tavurvur erupted destroying the large and prosperous town of Rabaul. Almost 30 years later, Pacific Scientific reporter James Purtill takes audiences for a trek up the steep slopes of the still-active volcano and for a tour of the nearby observatory, where a team of dedicated volcanologists study the mountain, preparing for its next eruption.

Ten Thousand Miles for Home: Protecting the Siberian Crane's Migration Path



This audio program takes listeners on an immersive journey alongside "Uncle Bird" Pan Shengyu, a dedicated protector of migratory birds.

Day one begins at dawn, joining Pan and fellow conservationists for a synchronized survey of bird populations in the wetlands. Through interviews and recordings, the program gradually reveals the results of Pan's decade-long efforts to protect the Siberian Crane and the gradual improvement of the local ecosystem through storytelling and detailed observation. This program creates a multifaceted and compelling portrait of Pan, inspiring listeners to actively participate in the protection of migratory birds and cherish the

Girl Rising : Doudou's First School Days



There's a famous Chinese saying: "Where there's a will, there's a way." This perfectly describes the story of 7-year-old Doudou, born with cerebral palsy, who has become a symbol of courage and determination. The program follows her over the course of a semester, documenting her journey from the start, through mid-term challenges, to a triumphant conclusion.

Doudou's life has been filled with intense rehabilitation, supported by her mother, who cares for her full-time while also live-stream selling to help with finances. Her father works multiple jobs far from home, yet the family has never given up on her. Their dedication, along with Doudou's perseverance, enabled her to realize her dream of attending school. With the encouragement of her classmates and teachers, her first semester marks a new beginning, filled with hope and possibility.

A No-Escape Apartment Building



The fire at a mini apartment block on Khuong Ha Street in Hanoi on September 13, 2023, left the nation in shock, marking the deadliest disaster of its kind since the 2002 blaze at the International Trade Centre in Ho Chi Minh City. The incident revealed serious flaws in construction permitting, supervision, and management, leading to the prosecution of investors, local officials, police, and inspectors involved. Tragically, this fire is not an isolated case. Hanoi alone has over 2,000 mini apartment blocks, many built illegally or without proper safety standards, with the national total estimated at around 5,000. Most of these buildings lack adequate fire escapes or safety measures, creating a looming threat of further tragedies.

To mark 90 days since the fire, a radio documentary titled "A No-Escape Apartment Building" has been

Lightening the Hidden Corner



The report focuses on the efforts made by different sectors of Chinese society to reveal hidden student bullying after the alleged murder of a teenager by classmates prompted the nation to reconsider how to prevent such tragedies, which are believed to result from unnoticed school bullying. Schools have improved hardware facilities, including audio AI devices, to detect student assaults. Meanwhile, education has intensified to empower students in identifying and reporting bullying cases. Moreover, after the tragic death of the student, China's educational authorities initiated a nationwide "rooting out" screening of student bullying for timely intervention. This case has also rung alarm bells for parents, urging them to enhance communication with their children and collaboration with schools.

The report also mentions the need for more attention on vulnerable groups like the millions of rural left-behind children, who are prone to bullying, with experts calling on the government and communities to provide more care and support to these children so that bullying among them can be exposed earlier.

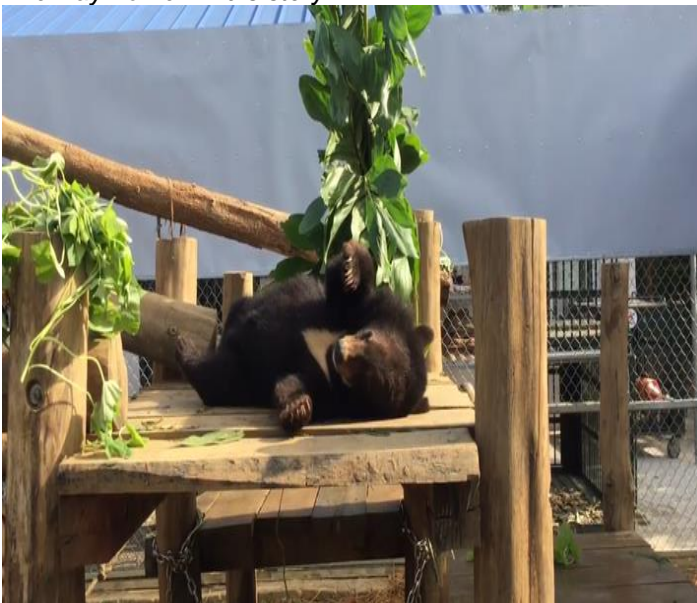

Never leave kids alone



Thuy Chi, a female student in the eighth grade at Xuan Non-Junior Secondary School in Hanoi, was admitted to the hospital in April 2023 due to a number of physical and mental health issues. She intended to end her own life. This comes after a protracted period of bullying and violence in schools, seclusion and exclusion from classmates. Prior to that, Thuy Chi attempted to signal the teacher for assistance. However, the form teacher chose to overlook this as a small disagreement and let the pupils work out a solution on their own, rather than taking preventative measures.

However, Thuy Chi is not the only pupil who suffers from bullying and violence at school. Around 1,600 student fight incidences occur in Vietnam each school year. There is a fight for every 5,200 pupils on average, and a student fight occurs in one out of every nine schools. Who will stop bullying or violence against children at school when parents are preoccupied with work and educators are focused on academic success? Don't leave kids alone in the fight against school violence!

The way home – Na's story



Asiatic black bears typically live for about 30 years. Na, who was recently rescued by animal welfare organization, Four Paws Vietnam, lived in captivity at a bear bile farm in Ho Chi Minh City for more than 20 years, accumulating more diseases than professional veterinarians had ever seen in a single animal. Some bears recover after being rescued and treated, albeit with permanent scars and after effects. Some do not. And even though they are brought to the Bear Sanctuary in Ninh Binh, one of the best animal welfare and protection facilities in Vietnam, their days are numbered. Because these bears can't reproduce outside their natural habitat, there's virtually no chance of reversing the imminent disappearance of their species.

But there is some hope in education and awareness. Every successful bear rescue rekindles a bit of hope for the species. The bears' stories, made possible by the efforts of tour guides, caretakers, and the staff of Four Paws Vietnam and shared with sanctuary visitors, are starting to make people care about the bears. Since this story was first broadcast, more bears have found a home at the Ninh Binh Bear Sanctuary and the Sanctuary has received more visitors, who take away a greater love for the bears and a greater respect for nature.

‘Melodies for Indonesian Children’ discusses the struggle to overcome the crisis of children’s songs in Indonesia. It delves into the real movement and consistency carried out by a musician in Malang, East Java, Indonesia, named Sugiarto, or better known as Cak Gik Arbanat, to encourage children to sing quality songs that are age appropriate. He initiated “Simfoni Cinta Tanah Air” or “Symphony of Love for the Homeland” as a form of “resistance” against the crisis of children’s songs. For 19 years, he has campaigned to teach children’s songs, regional songs, and national songs by visiting schools and villages, inviting children to sing according to their age while instilling messages about love for the homeland, affection for parents, and friendship. Cak Gik does social work for free.

Cak Gik has already composed 35 children’s songs, 10 of which he has recorded and uploaded to the Arbanat Music House YouTube channel and social media platforms. He does this with his three children and the Arbanat String Ensemble team. Even his youngest daughter, Melodi, became child singer, playing music, and also contributing to creating children’s songs. Cak Gik will continue to do this so that Indonesian children do not lack quality songs or miss out on beautiful moments in their childhood.

A young rural female teacher, who returned to her hometown after graduating from college, discovered by chance that the children were natural poets, so she started consciously guiding the children to write poetry.

At this rural Hope Primary School, where over 50% of the students were left-behind children, many were enduring separation from their parents, many were even facing life changes that were difficult for their young minds to understand and accept, such as parental divorce, the loss of loved ones... The young teacher led the children out of the classroom and into the fields, releasing their nature in the great outdoors, using poetic language to record their observations and feelings about nature. She encouraged them to write in poetry about their longing for their families, their regrets in life... Using poetry as an outlet for emotional release, she nurtured their kind, innocent, sensitive, and fragile hearts, giving them the courage to face life's setbacks and the pains of growing up. For these children, learning to view the world and life with a poetic perspective may be more meaningful for their future than becoming "little poets" who present at China's top literary award ceremony or perform on the widely watched Spring Festival Gala stage. Through poetry, they sought to reconcile with themselves and with life.

Thought-provokingly, the young female teacher grew up in a broken family. It was the love of her relatives that made up for certain regrets in her life. In the process of bonding with the children through poetry, she and the children healed each other. As she said in the program, "As long as you have the ability to appreciate beauty, you will always have the eyes to discover poetry"; "Even if you don't write poetry in the future, you can live your life like a poem."

The Bag: The Heavy Burden On Children's Shoulders



The critical aspect of addressing the issue of "The Bag" lies in its connection to the Thai education system and the substantial burden it imposes on Thai children, who study for more than seven hours a day. For instance, a Mathayom 3 student may carry a school bag weighing 10-12 kilograms, potentially leading to spinal curvature. Many children bear similarly heavy school bags without yet exhibiting symptoms.

Road to Carbon Neutrality



China has always been vigorously practicing ecological conservation and taking actions in global climate governance. In 2020, China made a commitment to the world, aiming to achieve carbon dioxide emissions peak before 2030 and achieve carbon neutrality before 2060.

To explore the efforts and progress of China's green low-carbon development, international photographer Sean Gallagher and conservationist Terry Townshend embark on a journey across the country, meeting with people who keep searching for solutions to achieve carbon neutrality.

They investigate practices in renewable energy generation projects in Qinghai province, the carbon neutral Beijing Winter Olympic Games, the National Reserve Forest project in Sanming, Fujian province, ultra-low energy coal plants, carbon dioxide capture and utilization in cement plant to witness China's reforms and innovation on the road to carbon neutrality.
